We find ourselves in the midst of Lent. As we are in that season of the Christian year, we are preparing to celebrate Easter. What does it mean for the Christian to prepare to celebrate Easter?

I have some thoughts that I'd like to share. First, "to be prepared" means to be confessed up. We need to make sure to ask God to forgive us for our sins of commission and omission. Why do we need to be confessed up? We want to approach Easter with a clean heart. The Psalmist addresses this in Psalm 51:10. "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me."

Second, we must be prepared by being read up. We need to spend as much time as possible reading and studying God's Word. Two great places to start are Psalms and the Gospel of John. Remember Jesus overcame temptation by knowing, understanding, and quoting God's Word.

Third, we must be prepared by being given up. Yes, I am talking about possessions as part of a tithe or systematic giving. However, I am also speaking about giving our time and talents. Don't misunderstand me. God owns the cattle on a thousand hills and doesn't need our giving. We do need to give, however.

Finally, we must be prepared by being prayed up. I have already mentioned confession. However, complete prayer needs not only confession, but it needs adoration, thanksgiving, and supplication or intercession. We need to be praying constantly not only for ourselves, but for everyone.

I know that there are many other items that I could add, but I have a limited amount of space. I truly believe if we do these four things during Lent, we will have the best Easter ever.

For the officers, staff, members of Raeford Presbyterian Church as well as the Owens family, I wish you a blessed Lent and a powerful and wonderful Easter.
